- (a) Describe the agricultural practices shown in Fig. 1.1. [3]
- (b) Explain **two** physical factors affecting agricultural land use and practices on farms. [7]
- 2 'Difficulties in the management of agricultural change are best solved at the local scale.'
- With reference to one or more examples, how far do you agree with this statement? [20]
- 3 'Labour is the most important factor affecting the location of manufacturing and related service industry.'
- With reference to one or more examples, how far do you agree with this statement? [20]

- 5 'Nuclear power offers a sustainable solution for issues in energy production.'
- With reference to one or more examples, to what extent do you agree with this statement? [20]
- 6 With reference to examples, to what extent are degraded urban environments easier to improve than degraded rural environments? [20]

- 7 Fig. 7.1 shows exports per capita for countries in the Asia-Pacific region, 2016–18.
- (a) Compare the exports per capita for the countries shown in Fig. 7.1. [4]
- (b) Explain **two** recent developments in different types of tourism. [6]
- 8 ‘The impacts of international aid are often negative for receiving countries.’
- To what extent do you agree with this statement? [20]
- 9 For **one** tourist area or resort, evaluate the impacts of tourism on the economy. [20]

- 11 To what extent was the role of government the main factor in the emergence and growth of one or more newly industrialised countries (NICs)? [20]
- 12 With reference to **one** country, evaluate the relative importance of the causes of its regional disparity. [20]
